July 27, 1949 - February 1, 2025

Arden Somers, known to all as "Butch," passed away peacefully on February 1, 2025, in Jacksonville, Florida, at the age of 75. Born on July 27, 1949, Butch was a beloved son, brother, uncle, and friend who will be deeply missed by all who knew him.

Butch proudly served his country in the U.S. Navy during the Vietnam War, from 1968 to 1970. He was a dedicated member of the River Patrol Force TF-116, often referred to as the "River Rats." He is also survived by his lifelong friend Deon Taylor and her son Ian.

Butch is survived by his loving mother, Margaret Bratcher; his sisters, Linda Wright, Joan Lutz (James), and Susan Hahne (Kevin); and his brother, Mike Zebrowski (Shelley). He was preceded in death by Arden Somers Sr., James Zebrowski, and John Wright. His presence is deeply missed, and he remains in the thoughts of his family and friends every day.
