He was also loved by many close friends, extended relatives and in-laws.

He graduated from Columbia University with a BS and MBA, and met his future wife Joyce, who graduated from St. Luke's Nursing College "across the street". Once married, David's career path took them to Corning, NY where Phil joined the family; Amherst, NH where Tim joined them; then 16 years in Pittsfield, MA. Joyce's quest for warm weather and diving took them to Orange Park, FL for 30 years, where dad retired from Lafarge in Palatka, FL. He accomplished his dream of owning a company - a machine shop in Keene, NH for a short time. He chose to work for smaller companies during his career as an industrial purchasing agent, including Columbia Bicycles, which allowed him to take samples of the latest toys home to his sons after the annual Toy Show each year, Gowdy-Shandoff's, and Bicron Electronics.

David was an active camper, and took several canoe camping trips with family and friends to the Allagash River in Maine and other exotic places. He was an Eagle Scout and was a scout leader and sustaining member for years. He was an avid game player, including Hearts and Scrabble. He equally enjoyed

a quiet weekend at home (installing a dishwasher or other projects "on the list") or a hike down into the Grand Canyon. He loved to cook and tend the garden, often picking fresh tomatoes for dinner once arriving home from work. David was committed to social action work, including participation in the Fresh Air Fund, hosting a 1980 Presidential Candidate's campaign team at the family home, and hosting an International Student exchange student. More recently, he taught English to Immigrants, participated and led discussions with the Jacksonville Human Rights Commission, dedicated countless hours to Wage Peace, and tirelessly contacted his Senators' offices to advocate for legislation he felt was important. He found active fellowship with his chosen faith, the Unitarian Universalist Church, in three of the communities where he lived.
