We prayed in his car one morning, me ,him and Keesha and we all had our hands on each other's and he cried tears of joy and said that " the angels were dancing and celebrating and singing over me "as he openly weeped tears of joy. We became close and formed an unbreakable bond, keeping in touch over Facebook messenger long after he stopped driving for sweet transportation. He is loved and missed and the memories I have of him I will forever hold near and dear to my heart. What precious memories they are. I pray for God to comfort Laurie during her loss .I'm sure she knows right where he is at and that they will be reunited again.
